REWARD OFFERED FOR INFORMATION
ON THEFT OF PLAQUES FROM LAMOUREUX PARK

Cornwall, Ont. – A \$3000.00 reward is being offered by the Cornwall Community Police Service and members of the community following the theft of several plaques from Lamoureux Park.

The Cornwall Community Police Service is asking for the public's assistance in identifying the individual(s) involved in the theft of 34 of the 35 bronze Citizen of the Year Name Plaques and a memorial plaque.

The plaques were taken from the Citizen of the Year Walkway located in Lamoureux Park at the foot of Pitt Street in Cornwall. The theft occurred sometime between the 23rd and the 26th of May, 2008. The bronze name plaques are described as being approximately 12" to 14" long by 6" wide. They are brown in colour with a bronze border. The recipient's name and year honored are engraved on the plaques.

A plaque honouring the memory of Carrie Lauzon was also removed from the same area of the park. It is also described as being bronze and approximately 6"X14".

The Cornwall Community Police Service along with businessman Bruce Maynard and Dr. John Edgar (Cornwall Academy of Medicine) have each put up \$1000.00 for information leading to the **identification, arrest and conviction** of the person(s) responsible for the theft.

NOTICE: Involved suspects, involved persons convicted, next of kin of involved suspects or persons convicted, and employees of law enforcement or correctional agencies, are ineligible to collect the reward. Should there be a need that a reward be apportioned amongst two or more individuals, the Chief of Police shall recommend a just apportionment.
